Organized each year on 8 November by the main radiological societies, the International Day of Radiology #IDoR2020 is a joint initiative of the European Society of Radiology (ESR), the Radiological Society of North America (RSNA), and the American College of Radiology (ACR). The choice of this date owes nothing to chance, since it was on 8 November 1895 that Wilhelm Conrad Röntgen discovered the existence of X-rays, a major discovery that earned him the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1901. Since 2012, healthcare professionals have been celebrating this day, which aims to raise public awareness not only of the role of medical imaging in modern medicine, but also of radiation protection and the function of the radiologist in patient care.
